Estimated time 30 hours or more to finish

To knit this model, you'll need:

34/40: 8 skeins of PHIL LIGHT in the colourway CHANTILLY

42/44: 8 skeins of PHIL LIGHT in the colourway CHANTILLY

46/52: 9 skeins of PHIL LIGHT in the colourway CHANTILLY

Yarn composition: 53 % Acrylic - 29 % Polyamide - 18 % Wool

Tools & materials needed:

PPY knitting needles n° 5 (5 mm) or other size following your gauge swatch.

Stitch markers

1 tapestry needle

Gauge swatch & obtaining the right dimensions for your project:

When knitting your gauge swatch, it's always best to do so "in pattern". For this model we'll be using the seed stitch and your 5 mm needles, with **yarn held double** (2 strands together). 14 sts. (stitches) and 27 rws (rows) = a square of 10 cm x 10 cm.

CONSTRUCTION

The different size options have been colour-coded in order to help you follow the instructions for the size you wish to knit with more ease.

KNITTING THE BACK PIECE

Step 1: With your 5 mm needles, CO (cast on) 105 - 107 - 109 sts., yarn held double (2 strands together).

Step 2: Knit in the seed stitch, meaning:

For the 1st rw: K1, P1 (knit 1 st., purl 1 st.) until the end of the rw.

Keep repeating this rw, every rw.

Working in this way means you'll alternate between knit and purl stitches, making a knit stitch on top of a purl stitch and vice versa.

Knit in seed stitch until you've reached a tot. height of 27,5 - 30 - 33 cm.

Step 3: PM (place stitch marker) on the last stitch of the row, to indicate the beginning of the neckline.

Step 4: Continue in seed stitch until you've reached a tot. height of 52,5 - 55 - 59 cm.

Step 5: PM (place stitch marker) on the last stitch of the row, to indicate the end of the neckline.

Step 6: Continuer knitting straight in seed stitch until you've reached a tot. height of 80 - 85 - 92 cm, then BO (bind off) all sts.

KNITTING THE FRONT PIECE

Step 1: With your 5 mm needles, CO 105 - 107 - 109 sts., yarn held double (2 strands together).

Step 2: Knit in the seed stitch, meaning:

For the 1st rw: K1, P1 (knit 1 st., purl 1 st.) until the end of the rw.

Keep repeating this rw, every rw.

Knit in seed stitch until you've reached a tot. height of 27,5 - 30 - 33 cm.

Step 3: PM (place stitch marker) on the first stitch of the row, to indicate the beginning of the neckline.

Step 4: Continue in seed stitch until you've reached a tot. height of 52,5 - 55 - 59 cm.

Step 5: PM (place stitch marker) on the first stitch of the row, to indicate the end of the neckline.

Step 6: Continue in seed stitch until you've reached a tot. height of 80 - 85 - 92 cm, then BO all sts.

SEAMING & FINISHING TOUCHES

Step 1: Place the back and front pieces right sides together. Sew the shoulders together using an invisible seam (backstitching), following the green lines on the pattern illustration.

Step 2: PM at 30 sts. from the edges (indicating the hem) on the back piece and at 60 sts. from the edges (end of the hem).

Step 3: Seam the sides closed using an invisible seam (backstitching), following the red lines on the pattern illustration. Fold the hem towards the inside until the stitch markers, secure the hem using backstitch and following the yellow lines in the pattern illustration.
